B. Kroc Institute, University of Notre Dame in the United States of America. He was previously a senior lecturer at Palacky University and a Fulbright Fellow at the Joan. B. Kroc Institute, University of Notre Dame. His research is focused in the areas of Conflict Resolution and International Security, with special emphasis on United Nations peacekeeping operations, privatization of security, and the EU counterterrorism policy. His work has been published in *Security Dialogue*, *Cooperation and Conflict*, *Terrorism and Political Violence*, *Studies in Conflict and Terrorism*, *International Studies Review*, *International Peacekeeping*, *Intelligence and National Security*, and *Journal of Business Ethics*, among other key journals. He is the author of several monographs, including *EU Counterterrorism Policy: A Paper Tiger?* (Ashgate, 2011) and *Private Security Companies: Transforming Politics and Security in the Czech Republic* (Palgrave Macmillan, 2015), and (co-)editor of several edited volumes, including *A Decade of EU Counter-Terrorism and Intelligence: A Critical Assessment* (Routledge 2016). Dr. Ditych is an assistant professor at the Charles University in Prague, a coordinator of the [Deutsch Security Square](#) research centre, and a research fellow at the Institute of International Relations Prague where he directs the [Global Prohibition Regimes](#) project. He holds degrees in international relations from University of Cambridge and Charles University in Prague where he also previously graduated in political science (his master thesis was awarded the Chancellor's Bolzano Prize).
